Transcription

Ruth L. Harvey: Now was it the same officer who told you to go down the street to, was this was this the same officer who hit you who told you to go down the street?

Paul Price: I can't, I can't say that, because there was two, there was two of them, one was up above the other one. And you see this here man pushed me on down the street and where all them people running by me and coming by me going headed towards downtown where I know one of the officers had me kept chunking me in the back with the stick and I tryin' to tell him I say "let me get in my car, there my car," and he say, "You ain' got no car, get on down," just like that and so then he popped me upside my head and I fell and I ain'...don'...

Ruth L. Harvey: Well, uh, you are saying you got out of your car, how far did you get from your car, when you got out to move?

Paul Price: I say about far about where that lady is sitting over there.
