Disc at the Red Sweet, or Sweet Springs, and arrive at the White Sulphur Springs (17 miles) early on the evening of the second day from Petersburg, without NIGHT TRAVEL, and with but 54 miles of Staging.

And within three miles of the Alleghany Springs, one mile of the Devil's Den or Montgomery White Sulphur Springs, and within four miles of the Yellow Sulphur Springs, all pleasantly situated a few miles apart, on the Eastern slope of the Alleghany mountains, in Montgomery county. The waters of these Springs are celebrated for their good medicinal qualities, the accommodations are excellent, and have been greatly improved since last season.

Visitors to the Red Sulphur Springs take Kent, Summerson & Co's Stages at Newbern Depot, on the evening of the day that they leave Petersburg or Richmond, and arrive at the Springs on the following day to dinner, and take Sulphur Springs early in the evening.
