GUERILLAS.— All along the Potomac especially there should be companies, 100 at least, in each county, with horses, and armed with shot guns, rifles or pistols, and a big knife. Each neighborhood might have a squad of 5 or 15, and have a signal by which to meet at a central place. Let them have no uniform except the *greyest* clothes each happens to have. They can act as a patrol, day or night, give notice of any invasion, or *landing* of scouts, spies, &c., and shoot them on sight. *Aim at the epaulets*. With such a guard we should be safer than soldiers or batteries can make us.
