


U.S. CONSTITUTION

- 5 British monarch during the American Revolution.
- 7 Enslaved Richmond resident who planned a revolt in 1800 to fight for the freedom of enslaved Virginians. (first name)
- 10 Prohibits depriving any person of life, liberty, and property without due process of law. (amendment)
- 12 The Age of Locke and Rousseau.
- 14 The ___ Plan called for a national government with 3 branches.
- 16 President's branch of government.
- 18 ___ freedom became law in Virginia in 1786.
- 19 Act of counting; a numbered list. (def.)
- 21 Surrendered to American troops in Yorktown, 1781. (surname)
- 22 Lord ___ issued a proclamation in 1775 offering freedom to enslaved

men who agreed to fight for the king.

- 23 Commander in chief of the Continental Forces. (surname)
- 25 Acts passed by the British Parliament in 1774 that closed the port of Boston as retaliation for the Boston Tea Party. The name used by the colonists.



- 1 1783 treaty; formally ended war with Britain
- 2 The Articles of Confederation gave power to the ___ and created a weak central government.
- 3 Wrote the Virginia Declaration of Rights and the Fairfax Resolves. (surname)
- 4 "A citizen's right to vote should not be denied on account of race, color, or previous servitude. (amendment)

6 "___ under the law" did not enter the constitution until 1868.

- 8 "Congress shall make no law...abridging the freedom of ___."
- 9 Collects taxes, regulates commerce, and declares war
- 11 Wrote the Virginia Statute for Religious Freedom and the Declaration of Independence. (surname)
- 13 The right to vote cannot be determined by gender. (amendment)
- 15 "Father of the Constitution." Wrote the "Federalist" essays with Alexander Hamilton and John Jay.
- 17 The powers of the executive branch are vested in this person.
- 20 Believed in a "social contract" between the people and their rulers. (surname)
- 24 The number of senators for each state.
