Yorktown Tea Party, November 7, 1774

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16 YORK TOWN, Nowember 7, 1974. ner THE Inhabitants of York having been informed that the Virginia, and commanded by Howard Eften, had on Board two Half Chefts of Qu Tea, shipped by John Norton, Efq; and Sons, Merchants in London, WC by Order of Meff. Prentis and Company, Merchants in Williamsburg, W affembed at 10 o'Clock this Morning, and went on Board the faid Ship, tiv where they waited fome Time for the Determination of the Meeting of T feveral Members of the Houfe of Burgefies in Williamsburg, who had ex taken this Matter under Confideration. A Meffenger was then fent on irr Shore, to inquire for a Letter from the Meeting; but returning without Di one, they immediately hoifted the Tea out of the Hold and threw it an into the River, and then returned to the Shore without doing Damage an to the Ship or any other Part of her Cargo. On the Wednesday follow-BI ing the County Committee met, to consider of this Matter; and, after A mature Deliberation, came to the following Refolutions : la Refolved, that we do highly approve of the Conduct of the Inhabitants fe of York, in destroying the Tea on Board the Virginia. in Refolved, that Meff. Prentis and Company have incurred the Difpleath fure of their Countrymen, by not countermanding their Orders for the D Tea, having had frequent Opportunities to have done fo; and that they N ought to make proper Conceffions for fuch Mifconduct, or be made to 3(feel the Refentment of the Publick. Doe I Refolved, that John Norton, Efq; of London, must have known the 12 Determination of this Colony with Respect to Tea, as the Ship Virginia did not fail from hence till after the late Affembly was diffolved, and the R afc Members of that Affembly, in Behalf of the Colony, immediately upon 11 their Diffolution, entered in 5 a folemn Affociation against that Article. ß 0 Refolved therefore, to convince our Enemies that we never will fubmit 13 u to any Measure that may in the least endanger our Liberties, which we V 0 are determined to defend at the Rifk of our Lives, that the Ship Virginia 1e ought to clear out from hence in Ballaft, in eighteen Days from this 15 f Time. w N Refolved, that Howard Eften, Commander of the Ship Virginia, acted 20 imprudently in not remonstrating in stronger Terms against the Tea being ĩf put on Board the Ship, as he well knew it would be difagreeable to the Inhabitants of this Colony. ts We fubmit to our Countrymen whether every Ship, circumstanced as 1. the Virginia is, ought not to thare the fame Fate. 1-Signed by Order of the Committee. 0.
