

## Anthony Rosenstock, Naturalization, 1869

That Beck Ray Stoll A Rosenstock & Charles Beck natives of Germany this day applied to the Court to be admitted citizens of the United States of America. Whereupon it appeared to the Court that Peter Beck in the year 1854, in a Court of Records in the City of Washington D.C. That Ray Stoll on the 9<sup>th</sup> Oct 1854 in the Court of Quarter Sessions for the City and County of Philadelphia Penn. That Ohio Beck on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Nov 1857 in the Superior Court of the City of New York, and that A Rosenstock on the 28<sup>th</sup> Sept 1854 in the Circuit Court of McLean County Kentucky each declared on oath that it was their free intention to become citizens of the United States and to renounce and abjure forever all allegiance & fidelity to every foreign Prince, potentate, State or Sovereignty whatever & particularly to the King of Germany. Whereupon it appeared to the satisfaction of the Court that said parties have respectively resided within the United States five years at least and within this State one year at least and that during all this time they have behaved as men of good moral character attached to the principles of the Constitution of the United States and well disposed to the good order and happiness of the same and the said parties now declaring on oath that they will support the Constitution of the United States and that they will entirely and absolutely renounce and abjure forever all allegiance and fidelity to every foreign Prince, potentate, State or Sovereignty whatever and particularly to William King of Germany. Whereupon the said parties were admitted citizens of the United States.
