## Lord Dunmore's Proclamation, 1775

By His Excellency the Right Honorab's JOHN Earl of DUNMORE, His Majestr's Lieutenant and Governor General of the Colony and Dominion of VIRGINIA, and Vice Admiral of the fame. PROCLAMATION. AS I have ever entertained Hopes that an Accommodation might taken Place between Gazar-Barrain and this Colony, without being compelled by my Duty to this most difagreeable but now absolutely necessary Step, rendered to by a Body of armed Men unlawfully affembled, firing on His Majesty's Tenders, and the formation of an Army, and the Army now on their March to attack His Majestr's Troops and deliroy the well disposed Subjects of this Colony. To defeat fuch treatonable Purpoles, and that all fuch Traitors, and their Abettors, may be brought to Justice, and that the Peace, and good Order of this Colony may be again reflored, which the ordinary Courfe of the Civil Law is unable to effect; I have thought fit to iffue this my Proclamation, hereby declaring, that until the aforefaid good Purpoles can be obtained, I do in Virtue of the Power and Authority to ME given, by His Mareary, determine to execute Martial Law, and cause the same to be executed throughout this Colony: and to the end that Peace and good Order may the fooner be offered, I do require every Person capable of bearing Arms, to resort to His Majesty's STANDARD, or be looked upon as Traitors to His Majesty's Crown and Government, and thereby become liable to the Penalty the Law inflicts upon such Offences; such as forfeiture of Life, consideration of Lands, &c. &c. And I do hereby further declare all indensed Servants, Negroes, or others, (appertaining to Rebels,) free that are able and willing to bear Arms, they joining His Majesty's Troops as foon as may be, for the more speedily reducing this Colony to a proper Senfe of their Duty, to His Majesty's Crown and Dignity. I do further order, and require, all His Majasty's Leige Subjects, to retain their Quitrents, or any other Taxes due or that may become due, in their own Custody, till such Time as Peace mey be again restored to this at profest most unhappy Country, or cemanded of them for their former falutary Purpoles, by Officers properly authorifed to receive the fame. GIVEN under my Hand on board the Ship WILLIAM, off NORPOLK, the 7th Day of November, in the STITEENTH Year of His MAJESTY'S Reign. DUNMORE. (GOD fave the KING.)
