Beginning at a white Oak and white Pine Saplins [saplings] on the West Side of the River and runs thence So60°.. Et Two hundred and Eighty Poles to three Chestnut Oaks on a steep Mountain Side thence No9°... Et Two hund[red] and three Poles to three Pines on the same

Mountain thence No ... 60°..Wt Two hundred and Eighty Poles to two white Oaks in a Drain of the Mountains thence So ... 2°.. Wt One hundred and thirty two Poles to two white Oakes thence So ... 22°... Wt Sixty Eight Poles to the Beginning

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
